The National Association for Gun Rights vows to fight any new gun control legislation

Washington D.C. – The National Association for Gun Rights (NAGR) today said it will oppose Sen. Dianne Feinstein's bill to ban "bump stocks."

"We're very concerned with the move to start more federal regulations on accessories, which would have serious repercussions throughout the rest of federal gun law," said NAGR President Dudley Brown. "The whole accessory ban argument is a red herring to get politicians -- especially weak-kneed Republicans -- to agree to ban something, anything and then see how much the anti-gunners can get.

"They want to get a bill to the floor of the U.S. Senate, where people like Joe Manchin and Pat Toomey will turn it into a gun control clownshow, just like they did after the Newtown tragedy.

"We won't play that game at all and we'll call out any and all Republicans who jump onboard that game."
