President Trump Signs Repeal of the Social Security Gun Ban into Law

Resolution restores gun rights to thousands of Social Security recipients

Windsor, CO – President Trump signing House Joint Resolution 40, otherwise known as a full repeal of the “Social Security Gun Ban” on Tuesday, marks the beginning of the end of the Obama gun control era, and a big victory for the National Association for Gun Rights whose members led the opposition to the Obama rule.

“We’re very pleased President Trump made history by signing this landmark Joint Resolution to undo part of Barack Obama’s gun control legacy,” said Dudley Brown, President of the National Association for Gun Rights. “Repealing the Social Security Gun Ban is a great first step to undoing the damage done to our Second Amendment rights.”

Last July, the National Association for Gun Rights delivered 89,000 petitions, signed by its members and supporters, to the Social Security Administration during their open comment period.

“NAGR members and supporters made up over 90% of the comments they received,” stated Brown. “We followed that up by sending more than 200,000 petitions to Congress during their floor debate this month urging them to repeal the Social Security Gun Ban.”

H.J. Res 40 repealed a last hour Social Security Administration rule implemented by the Obama Administration that would have stolen the gun rights of a projected 75,000 citizens without due process in the first year alone.

Social Security recipients, who were guilty of no crime, would have lost their gun rights forever. The signing of H.J. Res 40 does away with this offensive and unconstitutional gun ban.

“We applaud the work Congress and the President have done to get rid of this unconstitutional rule that infringes on the rights of millions of gun owners,” said Brown. “This was one of the biggest anti-gun legacies left behind by the Obama Administration, and its repeal is a big win for gun owners.”

The National Association for Gun Rights is American's second largest and fastest growing gun rights group. With over 4.5 million members and supporters, the National Association is especially well-known for its no-compromise stance on gun rights.
